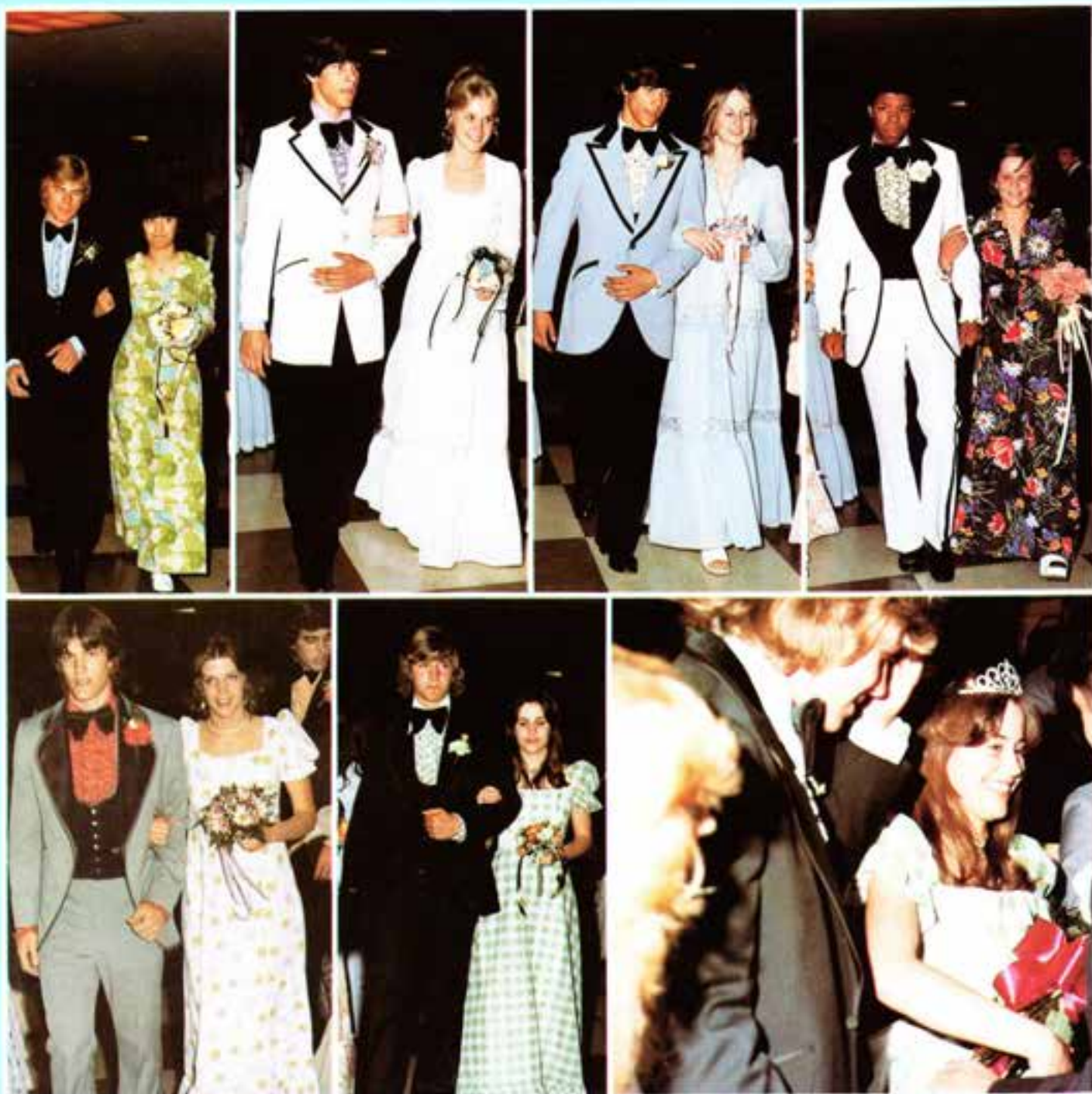
One special night in March, the theme of Prom '75 was set. On May 17th, our cold and commonplace cafeteria was transformed into a magical "Night in San Francisco".

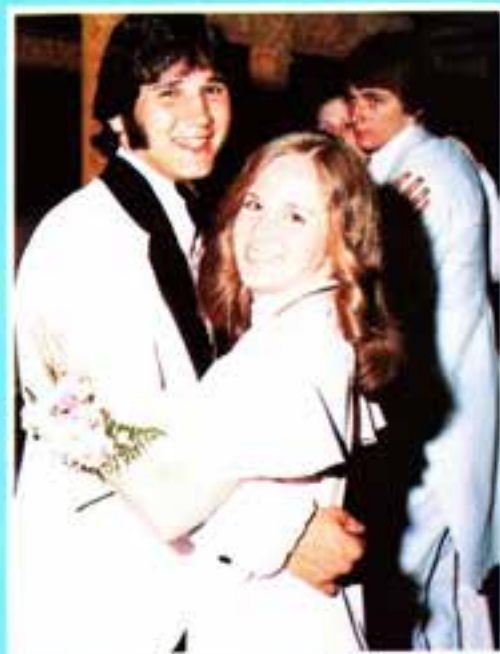

Moments of Perfection

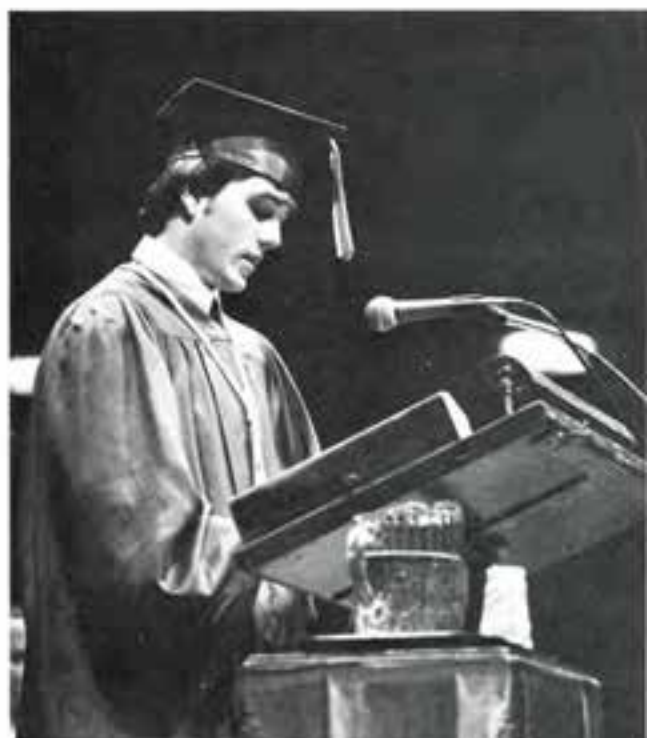

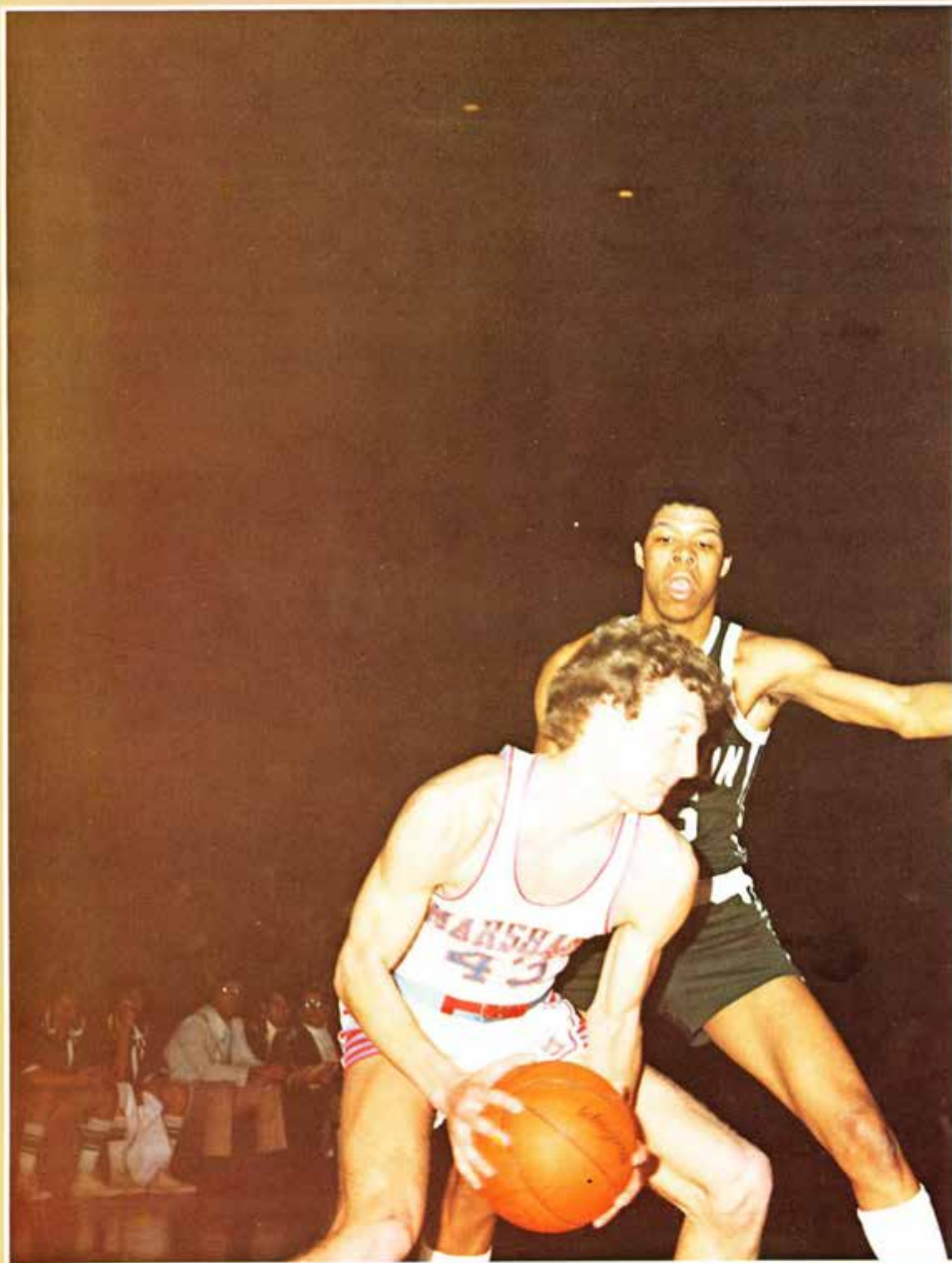

Although the weather was cool, the team was hot as the 1975 Golf season began. When the weather became warmer, the golf team cooled off.

On a cloudy, overcast day, Madison met its first opponent, Lincoln. The team took their first victory of the

season with a score of 9-0. Next, Madison challenged archrival, John Marshall. The Knights had a fairly easy time defeating them with a 6½-2½ win. These two victories seemed to be the key to Madison's confidence as they went on and won their following three meets. On May 7th they met Bay View, a tough opponent, and rose to a 5½-3½ victory. The following day, the Knights kept their winning streak alive by sweeping a quadrangular meet without any difficulties.

The rest of the season was unstable. Madison played

In summing up the season, Coach John Piacentine said that even though the team had a tough time following the preceding '74 teams undefeated season they held their own with great spirit and enthusiasm.

Track Team Takes Great Strides

The 1975 track squad started slow but finished on the upswing as the cindermen suffered a roller coaster season. After the disappointing indoor season, the team started to shape up. "The South meet and City Relays were the most important meets of the year," said Mr. Kotsubka. He felt

that these two meets were important because "the guys were really pulling for each other." The sound of their teammates pulled them together in a common cause, beating the team which was favored to take the City Conference title. Madison came out on top, beating state-champions-to-be South, by a very narrow margin. Later in the season, the team turned out to be bridesmaids to Custer for the City Relays title, one point ahead of third place Hamilton. Once again, they demonstrated the needed teamwork, resulting in an excellent showing. Although the

necessary teamwork wasn't always present, there were many strong individual efforts. These efforts were the second most important thing to Coach Kotsubka, since they represent an accomplishment of which each individual could be proud.

In early February, practice officially started. Thus began a month of long hours of hard work and tired bodies—and this was only the beginning. Many tedious hours were put in before the first meet, an indoor triangular against two tough teams, Custer and Racine Park. The team was

unimpressive in its third place showing. The short indoor season was officially ended on a sour note with the City Indoor meet. The team placed tenth among the city's fifteen teams. A few injuries to key runners hurt the team in many ways. The day's only bright spot was Jim Higgins' gold medal in the long jump, his second City Indoor long jump title in two years.

The Knights then moved outdoors for the remainder of the season. The first outdoor meet was a triangular against West and Lincoln. This was one of the easiest meets of the

season. Both teams lacked depth, each totaling about 30 members. Madison won easily by a score of 92-30-3. The Knights went on to win the next three meets against Washington and Pulaski in a triangular meet, 1975 State Champions South in a dual meet, and Tech and West Allis Hale in another triangular meet.

Nicolet High School was the scene of the next meet, the Nicolet Invitational. Many of the state's top teams were present. The Knights captured a tie for fourth place among the eleven teams present. Outstanding performances came from: Jim Higgins — long jump; Jeff McHugh — shot put; Bob Hoida — 330 lows; Larry Shurilla — 180 lows; Brain Schuster — 220 and the 440 relay team. Then in a dual meet, Madison beat Marshall, the team which would go on to become City Champions.

The team's next meet was the Greater Milwaukee Re-

The cindermen strode on, losing to Hamilton in a dual meet, and taking seventh at the Custer Invitational. At the all important City Meet, Madison placed sixth.

The strenuous practice was still not over. The goal of anyone involved in track is to get to the state meet. The

first step is the regional meet. Qualifying for sectionals were Jeff McHugh, John Beringer, Terry Beckner, the 880 relay team and the mile relay team.

Overall, through the long season, the team's performance was not always overwhelming, but always respectable. With the loss of many key runners, the road will be rough, but with enough perseverance and pride, the Madison trackmen will all be looking again toward another successful season and being on the top.

alas it was not meant to be — when the pressure was on, the Knights failed to produce.

The season was brightened by the placement of three Madison batmen on the North Side All-City roster. Representing Madison on this prestigious team were seniors Peter Benson and Greg Wojtal and sophomore Darrell Moore. Infielders, Pete and Greg helped the pitching staff considerably as they formed a solid right side of the infield at third base and shortstop respectively. Not many of the opponents' balls eluded these two sharp fielders. Darrell

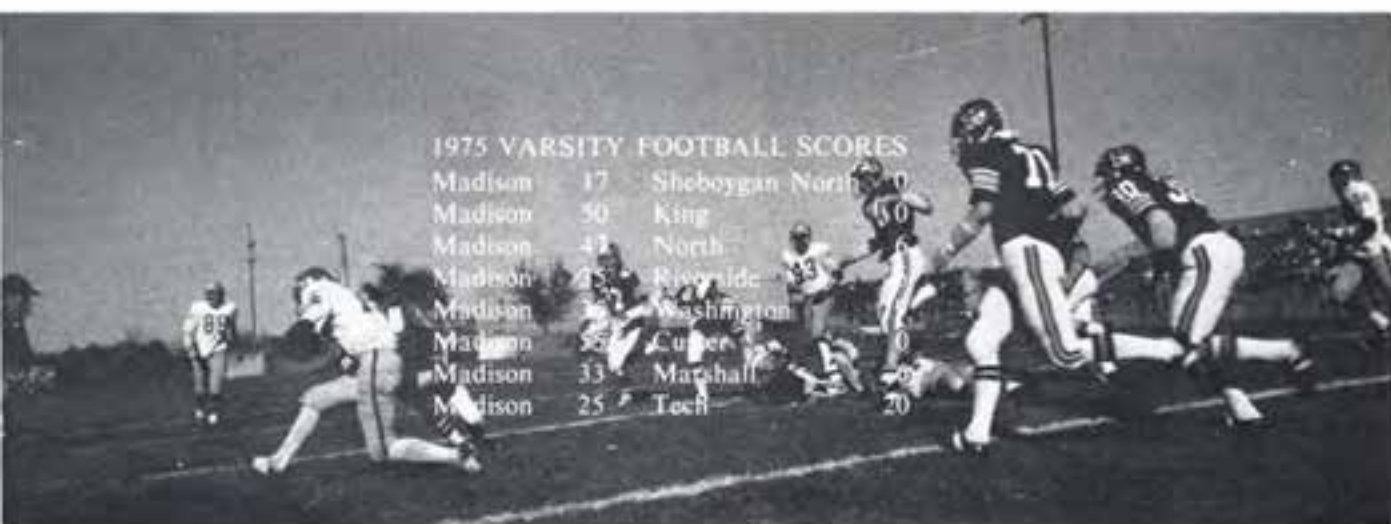

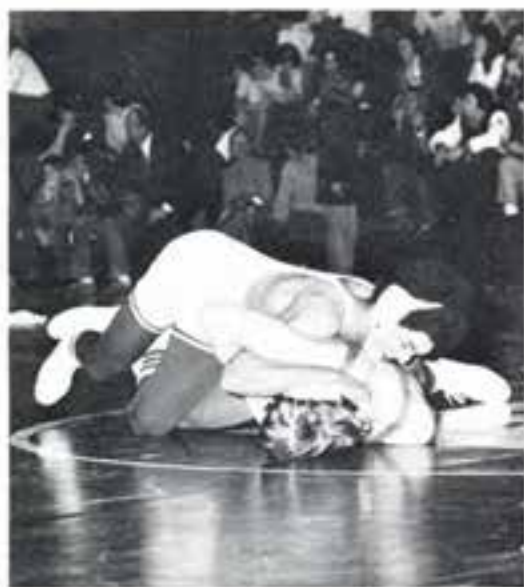

In the divisional cross over matches held for the City Dual Championship, Madison "stuffed" Hamilton 30-17 and Juneau 33-27.

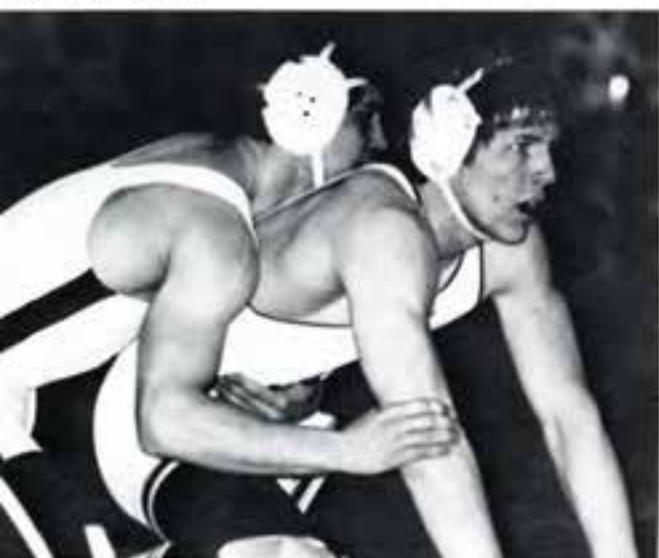
In state competition, Mike Brown, Dave Jaworski, and Bill Keaton advanced to sectional competition. Only Mike

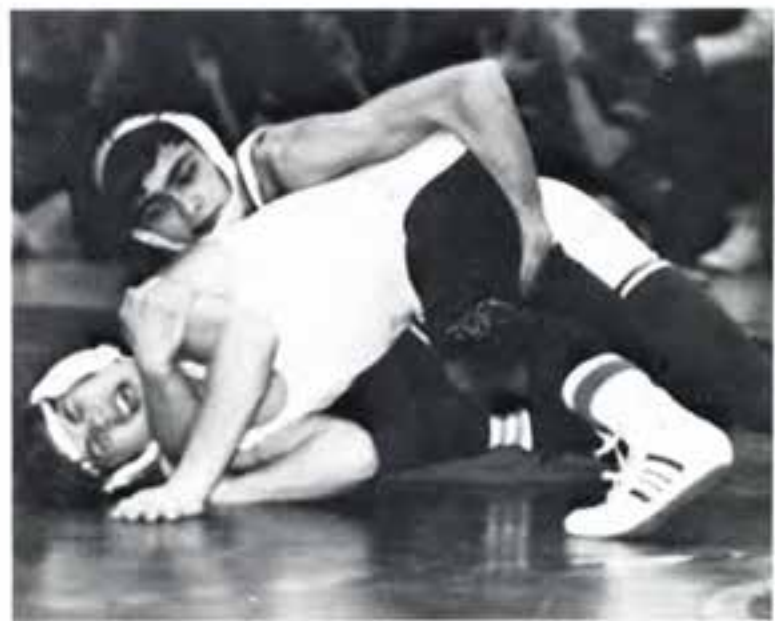

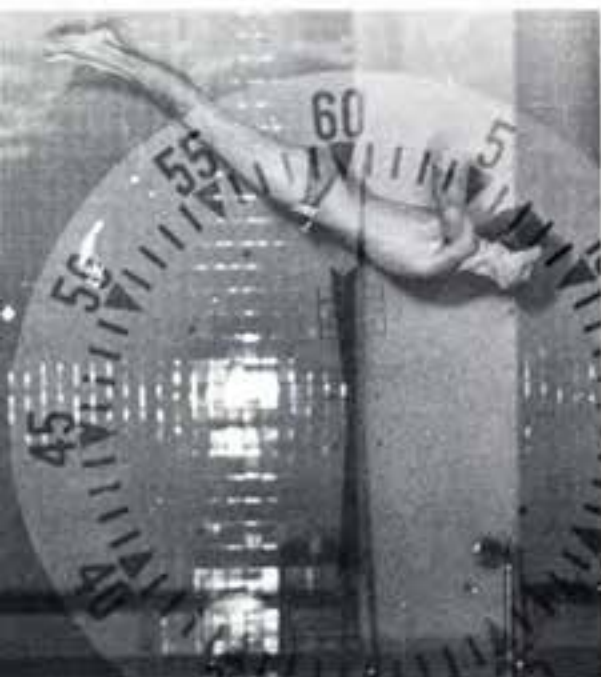

The end of the year brought back many memories to the ones leaving and to those people. A Choir will always remain a happy and memorable experience besides delighting the old as well as the younger generation.



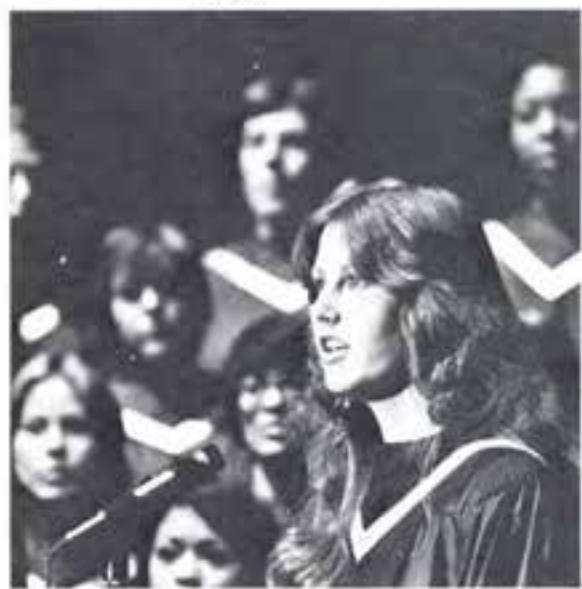
